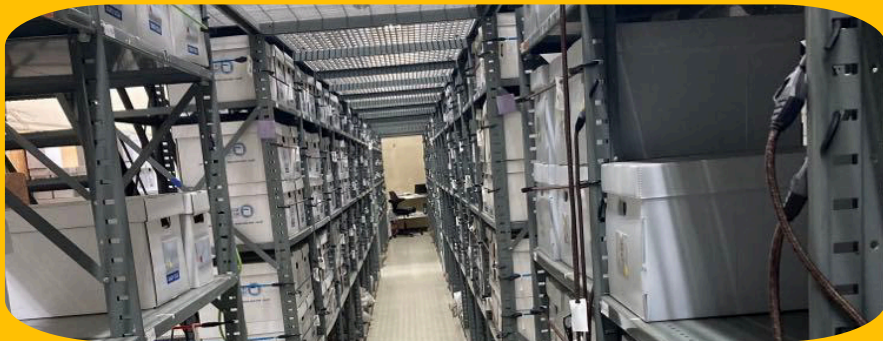


# TÁATAMAY INDIGENOUS ARCHAEOLOGY FIELD SCHOOL



**Táatamay Indigenous Archaeology Field School** offers students the opportunity to develop cutting-edge skills in archaeology, heritage stewardship, and land conservation in service of Indigenous peoples through participating in the Táatamay Indigenous Archaeology Project (TAIP) in the Santa Margarita (Táatamay) River Trail Preserve in Fallbrook, California



Táatamay is an important place within Pecháangayam homelands, and areas now managed by SMRTP, are accessible for recreational use alongside ecological restoration. While this property is largely protected from development, past archaeological work, ongoing public access, and even habitat restoration projects disturbed and pose new risks to sacred places within the preserve. Conducted in partnership with the Pechanga Cultural Resource Department (PCRD) and The Wildlands Conservancy (TWC), and the University of Connecticut, this project operates within the protocols and interests of the Pechanga Band of Indians to document and protect at-risk sacred sites within Táatamay while returning ancestors home.
